

## INTERVIEW WiTH FUTURE GROUP



#### 1. Do you consider COVID-19 to be an opportunity or a Challenge for your organization?

Our business is – Large format Fashion Retail Department store.

Currently an opportunity to look at business from Efficiency lenses in every aspect of the business, Covid 19 lockdown started as a challenge for the organization as we looked at -3-4 aspects of the business.

- a) Customers We used to serve min 5 lakhs customers across our stores every week. We had to think of ways to connect with them during these unprecedented times to ensure that they are safe and healthy.
- b) Stock/Inventory that we were holding in our stores to service customer demand for the following events (Travel, Weddings, Holidays, Back to School etc.) from the month of March onwards has been in our stores for so long, thus blocking working capital. The question was how to sell the same and release the monies and how to securely keep them during the lockdown. Some products have expiry dates as well e.g.: Cosmetics
- c) People Our staff of approx. 10K employees working in our stores. Many of them are from villages / other towns than their city / town of work their safety, and the safety of their families. With our stores not operational, how do we engage with them remotely and continue to keep them connected with the business. Most importantly, how do we pay their salaries.
- d) Store Infrastructure like Generator, HVAC system, Power transformers, Water facilities. Their upkeep and maintenance.

#### 2. How could you strategically take this situation to your Advantage?

We realized that in these situations, there are no templated answers. As an organization we need to face the same,

- a) We decided quickly that we connect back with our customers, and engage with them, ensure their well-being and connect with them to check if they are doing well and staying safe. During the second phase of the lockdown, we reached to our customers with a clear intend to service their demands of essentials for our customers, promoted services like Delivery of the essentials at the customer door step, following the guidelines of social distancing and maintaining standards as guided in the WHO guidelines.
- b) With our employees we were connected through their managers and we were constantly engaging with them, ensuring that they stayed safe and their families stayed safe. We were encouraging our employees who wanted to volunteer to helping out communities, mask making etc. Our teams were actively engaged in E-learning and thus skill development.
- c) We have devised new benchmarks on all aspects of business and put new metrics in place to measure productivity, cost efficiency, customer voice and safety aspects.
- 3. With the strategies in retail shifting from "Increased Walk-ins to Quicker drive-outs", how have you equipped your team to handle this new scenario?

Customer shopping behaviors have changed and will change. The customers who come to stores are serious customers who look for specific merchandise for specific needs. We have an opportunity to personally engage with these customers and make each customer feel special and enhance their purchases.

The overall conversion rate of walk-in to buying will increase and thus the average bill value per customer will increase.

We have re-trained our employees on the New Normal for us – reduced customer walk-ins, increase engagement while maintaining hygiene and safety standards, speaking about our stores as safe shopping destination for customers. Most importantly, we have identified needs of customers during these times and created curated merchandise packs, e.g. Work from Home Needs, Kids wear, Lounge wear, Skin care and Beauty etc

4. During the COVID-19, most convenience stores in the neighborhoods took advantage of the customer's immobility and got connected them at their homes. With a portion of the customers moved away to convenience stores, there seems to be an imminent need to re-engineer the value chain to gain lost ground. What is your take on this?

Our business is in Fashion Retail, mostly apparel and non- apparel merchandise. Our customer base are mainly not value seekers. While we realize that some customers would have sought convenience from neighborhood stores, some would have migrated to pure online buying, the experience factor still exists in physical stores. As the need of the hour, our store / product lines are available as E-Catalogue for the convenience of customers who want to choose merchandise and avail our Shopping by Prior Appointment and Store at Customers Doors programs

- 5. What are the changes that are likely to be seen in the organized retail sector in the future?
- Consolidation of many brands / businesses will be one key change.
- Productivity will be seen as a key driver of business.
- Every business will strictly watch their Spends Vs Earnings and ROI more closely.
- Stores which cannot scale up will get closed down.
- Customer voice will be a big tool that will be used by organizations as their marketing / visibility tool
- Compliance standards and Audit scores will be prominent metrics for business performance analysis

Initium: Can you tell us a little about yourself and what you do?

Feyaz Ahmed: I am from a small village chilly Balla Gandoh Bhalessa, District: Doda J&K. I am the founder and managing director of Fauz Properties Pvt. Ltd where we develop medium level residential colonies, construct houses, market other commercial and residential properties in J&K, Delhi, Chandigarh.

FauzProperties Pvt. Ltd is also working with Larson &Turbo ltd (L&T) for its power transmission project in J&K.
Fauz properties Pvt. Ltd have signed MOUs with CRP Risk management Pvt. Ltd, Mumbai for risk checks in Punjab and Jammu Kashmir, and with Alankit group for offering services to NSDL, UTI in Punjab and J&K and Kotak Mahindra bank survey in Jammu

Initium: Take us through your Entrepreneurial Journey

It all started during my time at NSB. I had got internship opportunity at a real estate company in Bangalore. Like any other intern, I was initially asked to work on generating leads and do cold calling. It was at this time, the director was starting a new vertical which was financial products. The co-founder who was heading this vertical was looking for someone to assist him in building this vertical. That was when a new door of opportunity opened. I was selected for this despite being an intern. I got involved in research, customer acquisition strategies, competition analysis. I started getting special attention when I suggested 20 different strategies to take the service from the expected level to the augmented level and 14 of my suggestions got implemented in less than a week. By this time I was being taken to al business meetings and I learnt a lot from scheduling a meeting to talking to businesses. It was here I found that business is only about creating a win-win situation for both the parties and adding value through any way and solving problems of clients/ customers/ end users.

I discovered that I am capable of doing these things and my confidence level boosted. I had many ideas coming up but for starting any business you need investment. After finishing MBA, I got job in education consultancy at Bangalore which has its own colleges too. Initially I was appointed as a management trainee and just after 3 months they appointed me as admission coordinator for J&K state. I found my salary won't be enough to fulfill my needs and wanted to start something part time. I chose to market properties online.

I made a Face book page and group. Initially I got only 2 to 3 properties but response from customers was something which I never expected and after my office work I use to go and search properties take pictures and post those on my Facebook page and group I named it as J&K buy and sell.

I used to send customers directly to owner of properties and just in six months I generated 3000 leads of new active buyers. The only thing I had to do was give my customers what they wanted. Some days I had to handle inquiries up to 1 AM. I did my job at the consultancy with passion and even recommended a lot of ideas to the CEO who would just smile and neglect the idea. I had joined the consultancy with an objective of adding value to the firm and I did not want to blow up the investor's money. This is when I planned to resign as I was making more money in one week compared to the monthly salary I received from the firm. I resigned, stayed for one month in Bangalore and completed the registration process of Fauz properties. Pvt. Ltd and went to Jammu started working. I hired 3 employees in the beginning we got very good response because our solution was totally different and 100% customer centric and till date our customer acquisition cost is zero and lead turning into sales cost is RS 2000.

## NSB's Contribution to my personal and career growth:

I joined NSB for a purpose; it surely was not for placements and big campus. My focus was only to get knowledge and wisdom through experienced professors who were there at that time Their practical knowledge helped me in making my goal more specific, measurable and achievable, contribution of our president sir and director for providing a healthy and peaceful environment and their unbiased approach to treat each student specially without looking at his/her cultural, religious and ethnic background was astounding and that has positive impact on my career arowth.

## How has the COVID-19 affected me and my business and how did I, as an entrepreneur take and handle this situation?

COVID-19 affected our business a lot, because we were offering services which are not considered as basis needs for survival, these are needs for raising the standard of living. We are continuously working on customer acquisition and selling online but our construction part is on hold due to non-availably of skilled labor.

Somehow, I felt unsecure if situation continuous, due to this we have started another E-Commerce Company through which we will be selling Kashmiri ethnic products like apple, walnut, almond, shawls, saffron and all organic and ethnic products of Jammu & Kashmir and India to retailers and consumers directly. The suggested name of new company is Kashmart Pvt. Ltd.



One thing that I liked the most about NSB: The unbiased approach of management for treating every student specially withoutlooking at his religion, race and cultural background, as a Kashmiri I felt safe and secure at NSB.

### My advice to the budding Entrepreneurs and Managers at NSB:

My advice to all budding entrepreneurs and managers is to identify yourself first, before making any decision, identify what is your passion. Keep only those things on first priority which are related to your passion and inner abilities, never ever compromise with the requirements of your inner self. Always keep this in mind; what you want to become and what you are doing for that, otherwise you will be like a ship which doesn't know its destination and for it every wind is the right wind.

## CHINA'S DIGITAL CURRENCY AND IT'S CHALLENGE FOR **U.S. DOLLAR**

The People's Bank of China (PNoC) which is the central bank of China has begun testing its new digital currency (e-RMB). This is the first digital currency which is set to be operated by a major economy.

According to domestic media the trials have started in cities like Shenzhen, Suzhou, Cheng-rency and the costs in making them. The du, areas in south of Beijing, Xiong'an, and areas that will host some of the events for the 2022 Beijing Winter Olympics.

The digital currency (e-RMB) will be pegged @ 1:1 to the Renminbi. This initiation was taken More than 60% of the global transactions in by China's Central Bank Digital currency (CBDC) along with Digital Currency. Electronic Payment (DCEP). This currency is decentralized, so there is no anonymity as in other digital currencies. The salaries of Covernment employees and public servants are said to be credited as digital currency in the coming months. In order to use this currency a mobile wallet application is needed to be installed in their smartphones.

According to the Chinese Government this currency is aimed to replace other cryptocurrencies like bitcoin by system controlled by Chinese government authorities.

Since e-RMB is issued by Central Bank of China, this will give the Chinese government authorities more control and give restrictions. on the day to day spending's of the Chinese people.

The e-RMB will reduce the usage of paper cure-RMB will help in making payments contact less and in a much faster way, and control the capital during any legal disputes.

the world is done in U.S. Dollar and the U.S. authorities can monitor these transactions. If there is an alternate currency for global transactions, then the U.S. authorities cannot monitor these transactions. Countries which have trade ban imposed by U.S. (Iran, North Korea, Syria, Cuba) could benefit in using e-RMB for their transactions globally.

In the long term this initiative is introduced to provide an alternate to U.S. Dollar settlements. This will bring the Chinese Yuan as an alternative currency to U.S. Dollar in the digital world economy.

According the route and time plan bus was departed and reached the Manjushree Plastic industry pvt. Ltd. At 11:00 am. The Security Officer Welcome the buses and guided for the entry in formulation plant and seminar rooms, the students were divided into two groups and one group was headed for formulation plant of one side area and second group was headed for formulation plant of another side area. Seminar room was very sophisticated where the tea and biscuits were served for the student during the lecture. The PPT presented there was very informative with the introduction of company profile and principles. The important process of the manufacturing of the different types of bottles were explained. Many students have asked the queries and the instructor has solved them very cleverly and politely. The production Manager Mr. Smitaranjan Behera has guided all the students how to keep a safety and sterilized aprons. He started with the granulation plant where he explained all the equipment and procedures used in the granulations. Also he has explained the strict regulations followed in weighing of the all required chemicals used in the formulation. After granulation unit, batch was moved for the actual bottles making machines, all the machines were of automatic and with high efficiency. We got a knowledge about the different type of Moulding machines which are giving different shapes according to the customer's demand. And gladly we are very happy to get this type of Opportunity to know about industries and the environment in an industry that different type of skilled people.

While the impact of pandemic varies from country to country, it is increasing the poverty and inequalities at a global scale. The pandemic has pushed the global economy into a recession, which means the economy starts shrinking and growth stops.

Due to fall in travel, global industrial activity has been affected. Oil prices fell further in March due to lockdown. Many sectors were badly affected, and they also have to face huge losses due to which large number of people was being told to resign, as it was difficult for the companies to pay the salary of their employees. Millions of workers all over the globe are facing the bleak prospect of losing their jobs. All the schools and offices remained closed for a longer period, so, online classes and work from home have begun because nobody knows when is this going to get over.

In the worst-case scenario, the world economy could contract by 0.9 % in 2020," the Desa said. Before the outbreak of covid-19, world output was expected to expand at a modest pace of 2.5% in 2020, as reported in the world economic situation and prospects 2020. The severity of the economic impact will largely depend on two factors-the duration of restrictions on the movement of people and economic activities in major economies; and the actual size and efficacy of fiscal response to the crisis.

Developing countries, particularly those dependent on tourism and commodity exports, face heightened economic risks. The decline in commodity related revenues and a reversal of capital flows are increasing the likelihood of debt distress for many nations. Pharmaceutical sector industry supplies over 50% of global demand for various vaccines, 40% of generic demand in the US and 25% of all medicine in UK. India contributes the second largest share of pharmaceutical and biotech workforce in the world. Indian drugs are exported to more than 200 countries in the world, with the US as the key market. Generic drugs account for 20% of global exports in terms of volume, making the country the largest provider of generic medicines globally.

I would like to conclude it by saying that covid-19 is one such pandemic which have already affected the growth of the economy globally and nobody knows how much more it is going to affect and when it's going to end. At this situation we all can only pray and hope for the best. Lastly, I would like to thank all those people who are contributing to the society in every possible manner.

Few lazy heads used to wake up late, few would beg me to stay,


Some said why you don't come twice in a week and others wished the whole year of mine.

But what if you can convert those sabji along with few items and makes it a tasty snack. Great isn't it! It will not only make your tummy full but also make you appreciate yourself for what you have made out of leftovers. Ingredients Needed: (Items increases as per increase in an individual):

- · Leftover sabji
- · 3-4 cubes of butter
- · Soya and Tomato Sauce
- · Chat Masala
- · 2-3 slices of Cheese

Recipe to follow:

Heat up the pan and melt 2 butter cubes. Put the leftover sabji and fry it for 2 minutes on medium flame. Add soya sauce and tomato sauce to inject taste into sabji. After a minute of cook. Add chat masala to give chatpata taste to it. Then cook it for 5-7 minutes on medium flame to bind all the flavors together. 


